



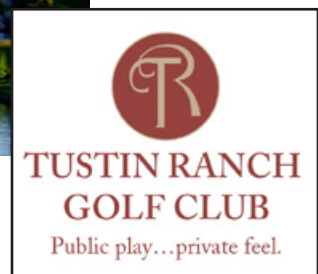

Providing Direct Services for 45 Years

The Mission of Blind Children's Learning Center is to provide early intervention, education, and services for blind, visually impaired and deafblind infants, youth and their families to allow access to education in preparation to lead independent lives.

Infant Family Focus

The Infant Family Focus program provides direct services to infants and toddlers (birth to 3 years-of-age) and their families, in the security of their home. Infant development specialists counsel and work with family members to provide the best possible beginning for their baby. Parents learn techniques to help stimulate the early sensory development of their infant. Families are helped with locating other resources and assisted in transitioning their baby into the Center-based program or other placement. This past year BCLC provided direct services to 108 babies and their families.

Early Childhood Center

The Early Childhood Center is a preschool that incorporates a unique reverse-mainstream model. Sighted children help contribute to a "natural environment" where children with blindness learn and play alongside their peers. Children who need extra assistance receive occupational therapy, speech therapy, orientation and mobility and play therapy. Braille is introduced early to ensure the child is literate and technology is introduced in every classroom. Children are encouraged early to learn skills necessary to become independent. This year 69 children attended the preschool.

Youth Outreach

The Youth Outreach program provides direct services to students (K-12th grade) in their neighborhood public school. Credentialed teachers of the visually impaired, work one-on-one with students, assisting with Braille instruction, orientation and mobility and adaptive materials. Students receive the maximum benefits of mainstreaming, while learning the specific skills necessary to successfully function in the sighted world. BCLC provided assistance to 40 students throughout Orange County.
